
2024 ATP: Development Process


- Stronger focus on making the on-street network safer/lower stress

2024 ATP: Bicycle Levels of Traffic Stress


- Set on a scale of 1 through 4
 - 1 is low-stress, 4 is high stress
- Corresponds to the 4 types of cyclists





2024 ATP: Pedestrian **Experience Index**

- Rating the "quality" of the pedestrian environment on an index scale of 0 to 100 percent
- Focus is on town centers, but has value for entire region

- Shared-Use Path Suggestions










Draft Plan Comment Inclusion
