

What are the most important ENGAGEMENT policy ideas and actions to focus on?

Culturally aware or similar training for those that are reaching out to the underserved or at-risk community members in order to maximize the potential for trusted relationship development.

Meeting those we want to engage with where they are.

Identifying trusted community leaders (such as Bill Martinez or Tere Tibbetts) to pair with as part of a door-to-door engagement activity.

Agree with the importance of creating outreach efforts to underserved population, but these need to happen more frequently, be more routine, and in an already commonly frequented location of the community members who are identified.

Add diverse voices to boards, stipends, citizens academy

Getting diverse voices on influential boards is also important, but prioritizing governing boards such as TRPA, SSTMA, TTD, etc. as well as our SLT City Council, LTUSD school board, and Douglas County Commissioners/EDC Supervisors would be impactful.

What are the most important ACCESS, INFRASTRUCTURE, and TECHNOLOGY policy ideas and actions to focus on?

Developing a communication plan with multiple channels that are frequently used by the identified community members in order to share up-to-date information about options available to them should be a priority. i.e. updates on public transit etc.

Dedicated unidirectional HOV lanes to get workers to and from their jobs during peak drive times (i.e. 6 am-9 am and 4 pm-6 pm). Could also be used during emergency situations such as evacuations or special events.
