Subject: Release of Douglas County Air Quality Mitigation Funds (\$35,666) to Tahoe Transportation District towards a new Transit Administration and Maintenance Facility

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Governing Board approve the Tahoe Transportation District’s request, subject to the conditions cited below. The request is consistent with the Environmental Improvement Program and Regional Transportation Plan objectives, Chapter 65 of the TRPA Code of Ordinances, and the Governing Board’s policy guidelines for the release of mitigation funds.

Required Motion:

To approve the requested release, the Board must make the following motion:

- 1) A motion to approve the release subject to the conditions contained in this memorandum.

In order for the motion to pass, an affirmative vote of any eight Board members is required.

Background:

The Tahoe Transportation District (TTD) are requesting \$35,666.00 from Douglas County’s Air Quality Mitigation Fund, as 5% grant match by the TTD for a \$677,650.00 Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) to support the site assessment and planning for the development of a new Transit Maintenance and Administration Facility.

The Tahoe Transportation District's current, leased transit facility is no longer fit for purpose. The facility has no option for expansion, and cannot accommodate the existing fleet, nor the technologies and space requirements for future additions.

Douglas County is working with Tahoe Transportation District (TTD) on the development of a new facility to be located on a Douglas County owned parcel at Warrior Way, adjacent to the high school. There is also a corridor planning effort underway along US 50, that brings the opportunity for shared use at the proposed site, including recreation public parking facilities, and a shared maintenance facility with Tahoe Douglas Fire Protection District.

The requested funds will be used as 5% match for a \$677,650.00 Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG), for a total project cost of \$713,316.00.

The unencumbered account balance for the Air Quality fund for Douglas County as of May 19, 2021 is \$314,469.39 which is sufficient to cover this request.

Conditions:

Staff recommends approving the release of these funds subject to the following conditions of approval:

1. Tahoe Transportation District shall only use the funds for the project cited above and as approved by TRPA.
2. TRPA reserves the right to withhold funds to ensure project priorities, goals, and objectives are consistent with those of the Environmental Improvement Program and TRPA's Regional Plan.
3. Tahoe Transportation District agrees to follow all laws, codes, and regulations adopted by federal, state, and local authorities/agencies.
4. Tahoe Transportation District agrees to maintain a report detailing the use and expenditures of all funds used on the project. These records shall be made available for review and audit by TRPA within thirty (30) calendar days upon written request.
5. All mitigation funds not used as described above shall be returned to TRPA. Upon written approval from TRPA, these funds may be re-allocated to another project.
6. Tahoe Transportation District agrees to request from TRPA a final inspection no later than 30 days after completion of the project.
7. TRPA approved signage shall be used on all projects during construction to identify TRPA as a funding source and shall include the EIP logo.
8. Tahoe Transportation District agrees to report the applicable EIP Performance Measures achieved by this project.

Regional Plan Compliance: The proposed release complies with the TRPA Regional Plan and Code of Ordinances.
