




#### **EIP Funding Model**



- In the 28<sup>th</sup> year of EIP implementation.
- Shared funding model.
- Average 100 million dollars annually for EIP across all EIP sectors.



2.8 Billion dollars invested



#### Background and History



- Lake Tahoe Restoration Act 2000
  - Legislation authorizing funding for restoration activities associated with the EIP.
  - Federal share of the EIP.
- Lake Tahoe Restoration Act 2016
  - Authorized up to \$415 Million over 7 years for EIP projects.
  - Appropriated \$114 Million.
  - An extension would add no new money, provides time to spend existing authorization.

#### **FOREST HEALTH**

- 37 projects completed
- · 21,000 acres treated

### WATER INFRASTRUCTURE TO FIGHT FIRE

- 7 projects accelerated by LTRA
- more than 100 implemented by local water districts







#### **Enduring Power of LTRA**



#### WATER QUALITY

- 39 projects completed
- more than 500,000 lbs of fine sediment and pollution prevented annually from flowing into Lake Tahoe



## AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES

15 projects completed,
51,000 boats inspected,
271 acres treated

## WATERSHED RESTORATION

- 17 projects completed
- 342 acres of wetland restored

#### LTRA APPROPRIATIONS



Since 2016, \$114 million out of the \$415 million authorized has been appropriated for Lake Tahoe restoration.

That is 27 percent of the total authorization.

The extension would allow time to fill the appropriations gap.

THE INVESTMENT OF \$114 MILLION IN LTRA
FUNDING SINCE 2016 HAS CATALYZED OVER
\$500 MILLION IN STATE, LOCAL, AND PRIVATE
MATCHING FUNDS.


