# ELIGIBLE COSTS & PHASES

- Planning, demonstration, or implementation
- 40% set aside for planning & demonstration, which has been undermet in previous cycles

## ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), SS4A grants seek to improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and implementation focused on all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation users, motorists, personal conveyance and micromobility users, and commercial vehicle operators.

#### ELIGIBLE PROJECTS & ACTIVITES

#### **Planning Grants:**

- 1. Develop a comprehensive safety action plans
- 2. Supplemental safety planning
  - A. Road safety audits, ADA transition plans, Safe Routes to School plans, lighting, or other relevant safety topics to enhance a safety action plan.
- 3. Safety demonstration activities
  - A. Feasibility stuides using quick-build strategies that inform permanent projects in the future (i.e. Delineator posts, removable barriers)
  - B. Mutcd engineering studies
  - C. Pilot programs for behavioral or operational activities
  - D. Pilot programs of technologies not yet adopted, such as speed safety cameras, variable speed limits, adaptive signal timing, and adaptive lighting.

#### **Implementation Grants:**

- Applicants must have an eligible comprehensive safety action plan to apply. Local entities in the Tahoe Basin are eligible under TRPA's 2024 Vision Zero Stratgey.
- Projects and strategies identified in an action plan that address roadway safety problems. For Tahoe, this includes not only the project list, identified in Chapter 6.0, but also implementation of any of the proven safety countermeasures in Appendix A.
