The Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA), designated as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for the California portion of the Lake Tahoe Region, is pleased to submit the 2024 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) to the California Transportation Commission (Commission) as part of the 2024 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The TRPA Governing Board unanimously adopted the 2024 RTIP by TRPA Resolution No. 2023-12 at the December 13, 2023 meeting.

The 2024 RTIP was developed using the template produced by the RTPA working group and in collaboration with Caltrans. TRPA requests the Commission program the Region's 2024 STIP five (5) percent Limitation Planning, Programming, and Monitoring (PPM) shares of \$165,000 for planning, programming, and monitoring as follows:

2024 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (2024 RTIP)

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A. Overview and Schedule

Section 1. Executive Summary

California state law requires the adoption and submittal of a five-year Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) by December 15 of each odd-number year to the California Transportation Commission. The Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) is responsible for developing the RTIP for the Lake Tahoe Region in conjunction with Caltrans as part of the development of the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The 2024 RTIP is the regional component of the 2024 STIP that covers fiscal years 2024-25 through 2028-29. TRPA's 2024 STIP targeted shares are estimated at \$1,845,000 thru 2028-29. The 2024 STIP shares were applied to the balance advanced (\$636,000) for the Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project leaving a net targeted share balance of \$1,209,000. The remaining 2024 share balance will be carried forward to the 2026 STIP to accumulate enough shares to fully fund a project phase. The 2024 RTIP proposes to program the 5 percent Planning, Programming, and Monitoring (PPM) Limitation shares of \$165,000 for regional planning and programming activities through 2028-29. The TRPA Governing Board adopted the 2024 Regional Transportation Improvement Program at the December 13, 2023 meeting.

Section 3. Background of Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP)

A. <u>What is the Regional Transportation Improvement Program?</u>

The Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) is a program of highway, local road, transit and active transportation projects that a region plans to fund with State and Federal revenue programmed by the California Transportation Commission in the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The RTIP is developed biennially by the regions and is due to the Commission by December 15 of every odd numbered year. The program of projects in the RTIP is a subset of projects in the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), a federally mandated master transportation plan which guides a region's transportation investments over a 20 to 25 year period. The RTP is based on all reasonably anticipated funding, including federal, state and local sources. Updated every 4 to 5 years, the RTP is developed through an extensive public participation process in the region and reflects the unique mobility, sustainability, and air quality needs of each region.

B. Regional Agency's Historical and Current Approach to developing the RTIP

TRPA has successfully collaborated with Caltrans and local agencies to implement transportation projects in the Lake Tahoe region. All RTIP projects are vetted thru the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) process and incorporated into the project list making them eligible for STIP funds. The RTIP implements projects in the RTP. The most recent RTIP project, Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project, was delivered by Placer County in collaboration with Caltrans back in 2017. TRPA programmed an advancement of \$7,600,000 shares in the 2014 STIP cycle to fully fund the construction phase of the project, the remaining balance advanced due (\$636,000) was deducted this cycle. TRPA is proposing to program Planning, Programming, and Monitoring (PPM) shares only, and carry forward the remaining 2024 shares to the next cycle. TRPA is looking to build its unprogrammed STIP share balance in order to fully fund a project phase in an upcoming cycle.

Section 4. Completion of Prior RTIP Projects (Required per Section 78)

The past four cycles TRPA's STIP shares have been applied to reduce the 2014 STIP advance of \$7,600,000 for the Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project. This project was completed. Without additional funding available, no additional RTIP funded projects have been completed between the adoption of the 2022 RTIP and the current adoption of the 2024 RTIP.

Executive Summary

The 2024 RTIP is the regional component of the 2024 STIP that covers a five-year period 2024-25 through 2028-29. TRPA's 2024 STIP targeted shares are estimated at \$1,845,000 thru 2028-29. STIP shares were applied to the final balance advanced due of \$636,000 for the Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project, leaving a net targeted share balance of \$1,209,000. The remaining 2024 share balance will be carried forward to the 2026 STIP to accumulate enough shares to fully fund a project phase.

The 2024 RTIP proposes to program the 5% Planning Programming, and Monitoring (PPM) Limitation shares of \$165,000 for regional planning and programming activities through 2028-2029. The PPM will support regional transportation planning and programming activities that will benefit the region's top priority projects.

Benefits

The proposed RTIP will provide funding to support project tracking and planning efforts that specifically implement regional safety, environmental, equity, and economic goals by aiding in the delivery of regional priority projects.

Goals and Objectives

The proposed RTIP is programming for a planning, programming, and monitoring project. The funding will support regional transportation planning and programming activities, including the development and update of the regional transportation plan and sustainable communities strategy, and the transportation improvement program. It will also benefit the implementation of STIP projects, monitoring and tracking project delivery, timely use of funds, and compliance of state and federal laws.
